- University of Osijek as modern European university
- Bologna process priority

Preparations for Bologna Process

- 2004/2005 first preparations for the implementation of the Bologna process at the University of Osijek
 - Sessions of the Senat on the Bologna Declaration
 - New Statute of the University
 - Committees for undergraduate and postgraduate studies appointed
- The project Study from students' perspective: Analysis of Student's Views on Their Study Experience at Josip Juraj Strossmayer University of Osijek

New programmes

- new study programmes for undergraduate and graduate studies set up in 2004/2005
 - Two cycle degree system
 - Implementation of ECTS
 - Functional integration of the University
- fundamental prerequisites for student, teacher and administrative staff mobility

New studies

- 35 university studies
- 13 professional studies
- 6 satellite studies adjusted to the Bologna process
- set up in accordance with The Act on Scientific Activity and Higher Education
- the permission issued by MZOS



The main aspects of Bologna Process implementation at the UO

QA – one of the major prerequisities of the Bologna Process



- the quality of study
- the quality of teaching (course units, modules)
- the entire study programme (throughout all tree cycles of education)



Main activities on QA

QUESTIONNAIRES ON

- teaching, examinations, competences
- communication with teaching staff
- level of information students possess on study programme
- student influence
 (on study programme content, workload in ECTS)

AIM

- to promote and assure the quality of education at the UO
- to be competitive in the EHEA

OUTCOME

- training of capable experts at our institution
- establishing the QA system of education

QA Project activities

nine steps training during one-year-period

- SWOT Analysis strategic plan
- Quality teams established
- the procedures for quality promotion defined
- administrative staff trained.....

BUT numerous problems too...





MEASURES SUCCESSFULLY IMPLEMENTED

- organization of mentor system in student guiding
- monitoring of the Bologna process implementation by appointing specific committees
- continuous monitoring and evaluation of student activities
- evaluation of teaching and teaching staff by means of student questionnaires



PROBLEMS / OBSTACLES

- lack of teaching staff
- lack of classrooms and laboratories
- increase of overhead expenses

MEASURES and PROCEDURES to be undertaken

• to increase the number of teaching staff

• to solve spatial problems - University campus

- to develop information system for managing higher education system
- further development of QA system
- creation of preconditions for promotion and implementation of student and academic mobility
