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EBIP

- One of the notable characteristics of changes in the European higher education system are steps towards facilitating and encouraging mobility of students between European universities.
- Its main tasks are to support faculty and student mobility through different programs (the most important are Tempus, CEEPUS, and Erasmus?)
- At the moment students still have to pay tuition fees
- For international professors costs are covered by the faculty

EBIP Courses

- Student and faculty exchange between domestic and partner universities have been an important part of the FEB internationalization.
- We organized lectures for several delegations from our future partner institutions (Zürich School of Management...)
- Local students have also opportunity to take courses in English
- Interaction between foreign and domestic students is also beneficial for improvement of their knowledge, culture and program
- Local students also benefit from international experience
- They are better prepared for international business practice.

EBIP Courses

- In small group teaching environment and through interactive teaching approach they will be inspired to study and learn, meet people of different cultures and from different countries, which is useful for their personal progress.
- They will get opportunity to be taught by international professors, participate in interesting discussions, organize workshops and mini conferences

- We currently offer 29 undergraduate courses taught in English as part of Economics and Business International Program.
- In fall 2005, we changed our study programmes in line with the Bologna Declaration and the prevailing pattern of business studies in Europe.

Guest Lecturers

- In cooperation with the United States Embassy in Croatia the FEB has been hosting Fulbright program fellows every academic year for the duration of one semester.
- The Fulbright Distinguished Chairs Program is among the most prestigious appointments in the Fulbright Scholar Program.
- Scholars are **outstanding US academics** who teach and conduct research at a university abroad for a limited period. While with us, Scholars organize teaching activities within the EBIP, present lectures, organize and implement students' assessment, conduct supervision of short student research papers etc.
